# **Meeting Purpose**

The second meeting of the Downtown Planning Team aimed to accomplish these objectives: present existing conditions; continue the Plan Team Meeting #1 discussion of assets, challenges, and opportunities; identify elements of a vision for the Downtown Plan Area.

# **Meeting Format**

Jacob Floyd, City of San Antonio Project Manager for the SA Tomorrow Downtown Regional Center Plan Project, presented an overview of the planning process, presented an overview of the planning process, facilitated an introductory activity for Planning Team members to learn about each other, and presented existing conditions information about the Downtown Plan area. Jay Renkens, MIG, Inc. Principal described the SA Tomorrow Comprehensive Plan that was adopted in 2016 and facilitated a group discussion. MIG, Inc. Deputy Project Manager Andy Rutz recorded comments on a large wall graphic (see photo reduction at end of summary) and co-presented existing conditions information.
